Initial analysis from the Hong Kong Observatory indicated that an earthquake of magnitude 6.0 has occurred at 9:03 a.m. on 14 March 2011 (Monday) (Hong Kong Time) near east coast of Honshu, Japan. The epicentre is located near 36.2N, 141.1E, about 140 kilometres northeast of Tokyo.
